



## Minutes: Membership Meeting 18 April 2021

### I. Call to order

- a. President Don Kile called the meeting to order at: 2:03 PM
- b. Officers present: President Don Kile, Vice President Willie Fields, Treasurer Joe Zapach, Recording Secretary Karen Klingler.

### II. Pledge of allegiance

- b. The Financial Statement was unanimously approved by membership.

- b. The clubhouse foundation work was started today, concrete removed from alongside the building where water has been running and washing out the foundation. Open areas of the foundation will be boarded with plywood and concrete will be poured.
